Job holder commitment

Job purpose

The purpose of this position is to protect the mauri at Omanawa and restore the mauri and mana within McLaren Falls Park. The aspiration is that this role will provide a blueprint for bicultural park management across the takiwā of Tauranga Moana.

There are strong links between TCC and the local community.

- Respond to customer enquiries, requests, and incidents within corporate time frames.
- Provide cultural information to visitors of Omanawa and McLarens Falls.
- Liaise with park users, user groups, volunteers, commercial users and the local community as required, including after hours.
- Develop and maintain collaborative relationships with mana whenua, contractors, government and emergency services to ensure effective operations.
- Deliver educational and promotional activities, events, and programs.

Parks infrastructure meets the needs of the community.

- Manage work programmes to ensure Councils vision, policies, objectives, and key performance targets are met.
- Assist and provide cultural advice to the wider Parks and Recreation team in relation to the whenua they are working on or propose to complete works on.
- Ensure that Health & Safety is considered and adhered to throughout the park. Managing this through Risk assessment and management.

The job description is not an exhaustive list of requirements, the job holder will be required to perform tasks assigned to them that are not explicitly described in this document.

Person specifications

Essential

- Experience in park or land management.
- Fluency in te reo Māori me ngā tikanga o Ngāti Hangarau.
- Grounded knowledge of mātauranga Māori and the ability to coach and build this capability in others.
- Experience in operating agricultural plant and equipment.
- Current Full Drivers Licence (including experience and appropriate qualifications in the use of 4WD vehicles and quad bikes).
- There is a requirement to work some weekends which is managed through a roster throughout the year. There will also be a requirement when rostered to work public holidays including Christmas.
