Job purpose

The primary purpose of this role is to ensure closed landfills and waste facilities operate in compliance with environmental regulations and council policies, while actively contributing to the minimisation of environmental and community impacts. The role supports the protection of public health and the environment through effective field monitoring, reporting, response and continuous improvement.

The role also supports day to day management of reactive waste services and infrastructure such as community complaints eg odour issues or safety issues and provides support to the Senior Waste Operations Specialist with remediation and maintenance projects.

The Waste and Compliance Team plays an integral part for our community ensuring our waste management services and facilities have minimal impact on the environment and meet the needs of the community.

Key outcomes

TCC waste assets are Ensure monitoring and reporting requirements in routinely monitored to resource consent conditions are always compliant. ensure safety and Non-compliance issues / trends that could cause environmental compliance. future compliance problems notified to Senior Waste Operations Specialist and Team Leader. Te Maunga Transfer Station, Maleme Street Transfer Station, Te Maunga Material Recovery Facility. Asset condition assessments are regularly undertaken and up to date. Sites are always clean and safe. Lead the connection between the City Operations Team and Waste Operations Team in regard to maintenance of assets.
