Job purpose:

The primary purpose of the Electrician is to provide exceptional service and solutions while maintaining TCC commercial and residential assets. This is a hands-on role requiring a registered/ licensed and experienced Electrician. The core duties of the role include installation, repairs and maintenance of our building's facilities electrical assets.

The Electrician must ensure work is completed safely, in a timely manner, meets the needs of all stakeholders and aligns with the contract specifications. This role includes first response, routine maintenance and reactive activities, as such the Electrician needs to be adaptable and considerate as to minimise disruption to the asset users/ tenants.

- Normal hours are 7am to 3.30pm, 40-hour week, but flexibility is required as some buildings assets may not be accessible during this time.
- On-call work is part of this role (additional allowances will be paid), typically one week out of eight-week rotating roster.
- Vehicle (not for private use) and all tools and specialist plant will be provided.

	•	Assess faults and customer complaints to identify if the solution requires a specialist sub-contractor. Identify scope of issue to pass on to Asset Managers and coordinate the subcontracted work.
	•	Perform routine inspections.
	•	Keep up to date with any changes to the NZ Electrical Regulations and other relevant standards and code.

- Ability to use technology including GIS maps, work tracking apps, MS Office suite & Excel.
- A positive attitude and a willingness to listen and learn.
- A track record in being reliable and committed to your work, taking pride in everything you do.
- The ability to abide by Health and Safety guidelines at all times.
- Strong communication skills.
- Honesty and integrity.
